QUESTIONS FOR APPLICATION & DISCUSSION

1. Do you find yourself praying more in this pandemic?
How is the Lord's Prayer a helpful guide?
2. Do we need to impress God in prayer for Him to answer us? How is what Jesus has done already enough for God to hear and answer our prayers?
3. Do you think of prayer as simple or do you find it more complicated? What gets in the way for you? Also what makes it easier or motivates you?
4. How does praying to God as "our Father" keep us communally focused and Christ-centered? Why is this important?
5. How does the pattern of the Lord's Prayer reshape our priorities? Are we aiming to change God's priorities in prayer or have Him change us?
6. Do we often wish we didn't need so much from God? Is it better to be dependent or independent? Are we hoping that answered prayer will free us from dependence on God?
7. How does the Lord's Prayer help keep us from saying one thing and doing another, especially in terms of needing forgiveness and deliverance?
