And a poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which make a penny. Not the Richness but the Reflection of the Gift

"The key phrase in Exodus 16:18 is "as much as he needed." It is an equity of needs met rather than an equality of supply that the narrative illustrates. Even though some gathered more and some less, the needs of all were fairly met. In the wilderness it was God who ensured such equity. Today it is the responsibility of each believer." — Baldwin
