## Hebrews 12:2

**John 10:11**

I came that they may have life and have it abundantly.

## Safe in the Father – *safety despite hostility*

◆ Hostility from the world (vs. 14)

“The world hates that which is not of the world; it does not tolerate that which is foreign to it because that thing runs counter to the world’s starting point and pattern of life.” – *Herman Ridderbos*

## Safe in the Father – *safety despite hostility*

◇ Hostility from the evil one (vs. 15)

“The Christian’s task is not to be withdrawn from the world, nor to be confused with the world but to remain in the world, maintaining witness to the truth by the help of the Holy Spirit, and absorbing all the malice that the world can muster, finally protected by the Father himself.” – *D.A. Carson*

# Safe in the Father – *safety despite hostility*

- Reconsider our standards for “safety.”
- Rest in the safety that is offered to us.

## Isaiah 43:1-3

“Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior.”



## **Luke 12:6-7**

Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies?  
And not one of them is forgotten before  
God. Why, even the hairs of your head are  
all numbered. Fear not; you are of more  
value than many sparrows.



## **Sanctified** in the Truth – *set apart although surrounded*

- ◊ Set apart though in the world (vv. 15, 17)
- ◊ Set apart in the word (vv. 14, 17)

“Sanctification does not happen apart from God’s Word. It is proven to us to be completely trustworthy.” – *Leon Morris*

# Sanctified in the Truth – *set apart although surrounded*

- We don't determine the proximity to the world in which our sanctification takes place
- We don't determine the means by which our sanctification takes place.

**Sent** into the world – *rather than taken out of it*

◇ Participation in the mission (vs. 18)

“Their lives are not to be aimless. They are given a definite commission by their Lord. Their task is to discharge it, even as he discharged his.” – *Leon Morris*

**Sent** into the world – *rather than taken out of it*

◊ Consecration in Christ (vs. 19)

“The disciples are not only safe but capable of continuing the mission.” – *Herman Ridderbos*



# Sent into the world – *rather than taken out of it*

- Recognize the barriers that naturally exist.
- Recognize the barriers we create.
